Scope of work

General Objectives

EIT Culture & Creativity will initially appoint a pool of external experts (hereinafter "Experts") to support the evaluation and selection process for the open call for proposals for activities to be included as part of the KIC's business plan for 2024-2025. The portfolio of proposals to be evaluated covers the thematic areas corresponding to EIT Culture & Creativity Strategic Objectives: Education, Innovation, (Business) Creation, Society and Systems¹.

Scope of work

Over the course of their appointment, experts shall:

Become acquainted with the relevant background document (all call-related documents and guidelines)
 and attend the online briefing/ training with EIT Culture & Creativity officers.

- Evaluate the assigned proposals according to the pre-defined evaluation criteria and following the scoring instructions. Experts will provide qualitative evaluation, which includes adequate explanatory justification for the score assigned to each criterion.
- Where appropriate, participate in consensus meetings with other evaluators to discuss and agree the scorings. When necessary, experts may be tasked to act as rapporteurs for the consensus meetings.

All evaluations carried out by the selected experts will be fully remote, and no allocations for travel and subsistence are assigned.

Expertise sought

EIT Culture & Creativity aims to support the Cultural & Creative Sectors & Industries (CCSI) and the digital, green, and social transformation of Europe. Through our Strategic Objectives and Actions Programmes, we expect to bring new players to the European Innovation Ecosystem, and strengthen cultural, creative and artistic driven innovations for global challenges.

We are looking to appoint experts to evaluate proposals in each of the Strategic Objectives with experience as outlined below. An expert should, at a minimum, cover at least one of the topics stated per each area. Experts must have a proven capacity to work in English (oral and written) and possess an advanced university degree (as attested by a diploma) or equivalent work experience. Applying experts' skills, professional experience, and expertise linked to the cultural and creative industries are desirable. Previous experience of evaluating EUfunded projects, preferably Horizon 2020 or Horizon Europe, will be considered an asset.

How to apply

In the Application Form, candidates are requested to submit their CV in Europass format².

By submitting your completed expression of interest you are agreeing to be included into the EIT Culture & Creativity expert pool database. The registration will be valid for 36 months from the date of our acceptance.

Registration into the database by itself does not guarantee that you will be selected for evaluating any applications, however it is mandatory to be fully registered to become eligible for future selections. Experts will be assigned proposals based on the specificities of the proposals to be evaluated and on the individual expert's areas of expertise. Additional considerations may be based on geographical, sector and gender balance.

If selected for a specific evaluation assignment, EIT Culture & Creativity staff will contact you to confirm your suitability and availability. Prior to any work assignment, experts will be issued a service agreement with guidelines covering; description of the tasks, duration, location (remote for the evaluation in 2023), timelines, remuneration rates, and reimbursement/payment methods. This also includes the Code of Conduct as well as the Conflict of Interest form for each assignment to be reviewed and signed.

Payments

The role of an evaluator under this call is remunerated with a fee of EUR 500 for 1 full day / 250 for 0.5 working days. The fee is inclusive of all taxes payable. The total number of working days necessary for the evaluation task assignment will be detailed in the service agreement.

The payment of fees includes the work undertaken to become acquainted with the relevant background document(s) (all call-related documents and guidelines) and attend the online briefing training with EIT Culture & Creativity staff, assess the application, related drafting of the Individual Evaluation Reports, and the attendance at the consensus meetings.

The payment of the fee will be made, within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of the invoice acceptance. Invoices shall be paid electronically to the banking detail/account number provided by the Expert.

EIT Culture & Creativity will not remunerate experts in case of non-performance or poor performance of the work and/or breach of any substantial obligations, including the obligation of confidentiality. EIT Culture & Creativity reserves the right to refuse to remunerate experts for any report or other deliverable submitted beyond the dates and timelines requested in the service agreement. EIT Culture & Creativity reserves the right to recover any payment made to Expert who has breached the obligations arising from the declarations of confidentiality and no conflict of interest.

Award criteria

Candidates will be assessed on their CV and online form provided at the link below.

Applications will close on 1 March 2023 at 10am CET.

Selected candidates will be informed from 6 March 2023 in case of inclusion in the roster of experts.

EIT Culture & Creativity values diversity and welcomes applications from all suitably qualified candidates regardless of age, gender, race, disability, sexual orientation, religion, or ethnic background.

A declaration of impartiality and confidentiality will be issued for its signature at the same time to be signed with the service agreement.
